Music and TheCharityChallenge.net Bring People Together

The Tamarack Lodge will host an amazing Music Fest put on by TheCharityChallenge. net on Sunday, October 2, 2022, featuring incredible music, vendors, raffles, food, and family-friendly fun. The musical lineup includes the region's hottest bands featuring Red Light, Whiskey Blvd, Ed Peabody & The Big Blue Thang, Big "Dawg" Isaac, Stone County and Nick Casey. Collectively, these bands offer many genres of music including classic rock, country, rhythm & blues and acoustic.

TheCharityChallenge.net believes that Music heals. This event-based organization was born, in 2014, out of a burning desire for change. When founder, Ceci Iliff, realized the barriers to treatment for her son's mental health challenges and substance abuse were nearly insurmountable, she decided to take action.

"We need to change the way we regard the disease and bring people together to raise awareness and inspire compassion for people who are struggling. Everyone knows someone, and Together WE are Stronger", lliff said.

She fought relentlessly for 15 years to save her son Benjamin, who faced many challenges in his short 28 years, but he died of a Fentanyl overdose, on January 11, 2019. Ceci has spent the last few years turning her grief into action. Though her life will never be the same, she is on a mission to bring light to an epidemic that is raging out of control and claiming hundreds of lives each day.

"We need better solutions. The organization we support with the proceeds from our Annual Tamarack Music Fest, and other events throughout the year, is a CT nonprofit dedicated to creating real, long-term solutions for individuals and families." Iliff said. "With proper funding, TriCircle will someday have a 15-month, residential program that will offer an uninterrupted long-term continuum of care and every single resource needed to thrive in life." Iliff added, "Every drug addiction comes with mental health challenges. To the individuals who are struggling, drugs aren't the problem, they are the solution to the problem. We should be treating the root causes more effectively right along with the actual addiction, a long-known disease of the brain."

This event is an opportunity to bring people together, to raise money and awareness, to help build a strong foundation for TriCircle, and to reduce the shame and stigma that surround this disease.

"When we dance and sing together, there is a sense of community, where everyone moves together with shared intentions and a mutual goal. Music is a collective experience." Quoted by Shahram Heremat, Ph.D. in an article written in Psychology Today.

New Ground Transportation Center Opens at Bradley International Airport

The newly opened, \$210 million facility offers easier access to rental cars and more public parking – and in the future it will also provide improved access to public transit.

The ground transportation center is located adjacent to the airport's main terminal, Terminal A, and spans across 13.4 acres. It has five floors and is comprised of dedicated space for rental cars, public parking and future, improved access to public transit. The majority of the facility space is allocated for rental car operations, which include a customer service building, a dedicated area for vehicle drop off and pick-up called "ready return," and a "quick turnaround facility" which houses fueling and car washing services.

In addition to improved access to rental cars and reduction in carbon dioxide emissions due to fewer shuttle bus operations, the new facility has also increased the airport's overall parking availability by ten percent with the addition of 830 new general parking spots. More than half of those are covered and all are within a short walking distance to/ from Terminal A.

The airport has also relocated charter bus operations from the arrivals roadway to the new ground transportation center, further reducing traffic congestion. In the future, there will be also a dedicated area that will be used to receive high-frequency buses connecting the airport to the CTRail line, as well as regional bus services.

The facility was constructed in partnership with ConRac Solutions, WSP USA, Inc., Austin Commercial, KBE Building Corporation and PGAL.

No taxpayer funds have been used to pay for the facility; it is financed solely by customer facility charge revenues.

Mitchell College and New London Public Schools Sign Dual-Enrollment Partnership Agreement

Mitchell College and New London Public Schools (NLPS) are partnering to provide dual enrollment to New London High School (NLHS) students, giving them an opportunity to take courses at Mitchell College. Mitchell College President Tracy Y. Espy and NLPS Superintendent Cynthia Ritchie signed a dual-enrollment partnership agreement at a recent orientation and ice cream social for the dualenrolled NLHS students at Mitchell College.

NLHS students, who are identified by NLHS guidance counselors and teachers, will have the opportunity to enroll in a choice of three Mitchell College courses for Fall 2022: Introduction to Applied Exercise Science, Introduction to Early Childhood Education and Introduction to Race, Ethnicity, and Culture. Additional courses will be offered in Spring 2023.

NLHS students who successfully complete 6+ credit hours at Mitchell and earn a grade of "C" or better in each course will be given priority admissions to Mitchell College upon successful completion of their high school diploma.

In addition, enrolled NLHS students will receive a Mitchell identification card, which will enable them to access the Mitchell College library and dining hall and events of interest (such as athletics and performing arts). Mitchell College tutoring services will also be available to dual-enrolled students.

Girard, the recipient from the Connecticut area, attributes much of her personal growth and leadership skills from her volunteerism and involvement in the broader community. In her essay, she described her experience with the Spanish Honor Society where she served as a group leader, working with elementary students and creating Spanish learning activities aimed to inspire them to learn a foreign language through fun.
