Pitching Easy, LLC. Owner Dennis Long Pursues his Passion of Coaching

"It's not really work when you love what you do"

New to the Chamber, but not to baseball, Dennis Long, Owner of **Pitching Easy, LLC**. branched out into the business world by launching a company with a focus on training, coaching, mentoring, and sports counseling. Whether you are new to the game or an active player, Long provides individuals with a well rounded skill set of the game, aiming to build the confidence of his clients.

What's your small business story? How did you decide to launch this business and what have you learned that would help other small businesses?

Few people are able to say they are doing what they always loved to do as their job. I don't take that feeling for granted. Pitching Easy literally began as a side job in 1984, helping the sons and daughters of co-workers with their baseball skills. What began as helping three or four kids on a summer weeknight grew into upwards of 80 individual lessons per week. At this point, in 2004, Pitching Easy was officially launched.

Aspiring young coaches - some former MLB players - have viewed Pitching Easy on social media and asked about starting their own instruction business. My answer is, "Don't quit your day job just yet." It takes thousands of conversations and relationships before someone can comfortably transition to a sole proprietorship and make it successfully grow.

What aspect of your business are you passionate about?

Teaching young athletes to remain positive toward their goals and dreams is the motivation behind Pitching Easy. Parents often ask to talk with their child or meet as a family to discuss goals and progress toward those goals.

Baseball is my lifelong love. The game has given me lifelong experiences I will never forget and that amazing feeling is what I seek to pass along to young players each day.

How does your business impact the local community?

There is a good chance that a sibling, child, or friend has experienced baseball through Pitching Easy. The common thread through the businesses in the Eastern Chamber is that many of us have children or siblings who aspire to do great things with their lives. Mystic Aquarium Celebrates Federal Funding for Blue Economy Workforce Development Initiative

Mystic Aquarium announced it is receiving \$650,000 in federal funding, secured by U.S. Senators Chris Murphy and Richard Blumenthal with support from U.S. Representatives Rosa DeLauro and Joe Courtney in the Fiscal Year 2023 omnibus appropriations agreement, to establish the Blue Economy Workforce Development Initiative: Creating a Pathway for Underserved Youth. The initiative recognizes the region's growing blue economy sector, the commitment to the responsible development of offshore wind to combat climate change, the need for a diverse, skilled workforce, and the reality that underserved youth face many barriers to entry.

The Blue Economy Initiative is a partnership between Mystic Aquarium and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. Key players are the Chamber of Commerce of Eastern Connecticut's Innovation Center in New London, and 10 youth-serving organizations throughout Connecticut. "We are excited to be part of this forward-thinking initiative," said Tony Sheridan, President & CEO of the Chamber of Commerce of Eastern Connecticut. "Mystic Aquarium provides unique education and workforce development opportunities in these industries that so desperately need talented and skilled workers. Marine careers are very important to this region and its future. This initiative will prepare and inspire the next generation and help ensure Connecticut remains at the forefront of the emerging Blue Economy."

With Connecticut being a critical hub for the burgeoning offshore wind industry, this innovative public private partnership will help young people develop awareness, interest, knowledge, and skills to help prepare them for competitive jobs in an emerging regional industry that desperately needs skilled workers. While focusing on underserved youth from major urban centers in Connecticut, the initiative's website and digital resources will have a national reach, utilized by Mystic Aquarium's network of partner youthserving organizations located in high-needs communities in 28 states and Puerto Rico.

While most Blue Economy workforce development initiatives are aimed at higher education, that is often too late for many low-income, and BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, people of color) youth, who may already be turned off, or turned away, from these careers. Mystic Aquarium is addressing this problem as a priority. "By introducing k-12 youth and educators to exciting blue economy content and connecting them with career professionals and role models that are diverse and relatable, young people will be more likely to pursue related coursework, understand career pathways, and see those careers as both desirable and attainable." said Katie Cubina, Senior Vice President for Mission Programs at Mystic Aquarium. "We are so grateful to our U.S. Representatives for advocating for this exciting initiative, and to our many partners who are committed to working with us to develop and test this innovative model".

Airline Expansions Continue at Bradley Airport

Breeze Airways continues expansion at Bradley International Airport, introducing new nonstop routes to Tampa, Fort Myers and New Orleans, plus one-stop BreezeThru flights to Los Angeles. The new routes will launch in May, 2023, with the nonstops now on sale at introductory fares, from just \$39* one way.

Bradley is also welcoming new, nonstop service to San Juan with Spirit Airlines. The new service to San Juan, PR will launch on June 7, with flights now on sale starting at \$74 one-way.

Spirit's new route will operate year-round, three times a week on Wednesdays, Fridays, and Sundays.

In December 2022, the airline launched the airport's first nonstop flight to Montego Bay, Jamaica. In addition, it operates nonstop service to Fort Myers, FL, Myrtle Beach, SC, Orlando, FL, and Tampa, FL.



DOD Now Accepting Applications for New Military Spouse Career Accelerator Pilot

The Defense Department launched a 12week paid fellowship program to expand employment opportunities for eligible military spouses.

The Military Spouse Career Accelerator Pilot program provides spouses of currently serving members of the U.S. Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force and Space Force, to include active, reserve and National Guard components, with paid fellowships at civilian employers across various industries and locations.

Military spouses who are accepted into the program will be placed with host companies that match their location and work experience, among other factors. Spouses will receive in-person or professional training and mentoring. At the end of the fellowship, spouses who excel in the program may be invited to join the host company as a direct hire.

Spouses can find more information about eligibility and learn how to apply for this unique opportunity on MySECO, the website of the Spouse Education and Career Opportunities program.

By partnering with the fellowship program, employers gain access to a pipeline of military spouse fellows that are equipped with education, transferable skills and experience in a variety of roles and industries. They represent a diverse population faced with challenges finding and maintaining careers due to frequent relocations.
